We adopt the WA Positive Behaviour Support Program, led by Miss Merrilee Edgar and use this whole-school approach to:

- build on our school's existing strengths, positive behaviour programs and strategies;
- \cdot develop a consultative and collaborative community-owned process which is facilitated through a school-based WA PBS leadership team;
- build a consistent approach to positive behaviour expectations;
- · develop common language and understanding of positive behaviour;
- · develop procedures for responding to behaviour errors, with a focus on re-teaching; and
- · identify when behaviour should be managed by the teacher or referred to school leaders.
- use discipline data to help:

- track progress;
- · identify areas for intervention; and
- track the effectiveness of interventions.

I would like to give you another friendly reminder about road safety and parking around the school, especially in wet weather. Here is some information from the City of Stirling Website regarding safe parking around schools:

Unlawful parking in school areas is a major safety hazard that poses a risk to children, pedestrians and other road users.

School parking

It is an offence to stop or park a vehicle:

- · In No Stopping or No Parking areas
- · So that it obstructs a footpath
- On a verge without the owner's consent
- Facing the wrong way
- So that it is double-parked
- · Within three metres of a continuous dividing line or median strip
- · Within 10 metres of an intersection/corner (without traffic control signals)
- · In a manner that blocks a driveway
- · On a median strip or traffic island
- So that any portion is within a bus zone.

Please be aware that infringements may be issued for these offences.

Safe parking at schools - City of Stirling

Thank you for keeping us all safe.

Also, remember that dogs are not permitted (even on leashes) on our school grounds. This is a School Education Regulation 2000 (Regulation 70) and again we appreciate your support with this matter.

School Information

Our before-school routine for student safety is going well. Our school gates open at 8:30 am and the students assemble near the Library/playground area will continue. This is a quiet time for students to have the opportunity to catch up with their friends and me; it is not playtime. At 8:40 am students are dismissed to go to class. If you are with your child/ren you may walk to their classroom and wait there during this time. If it is raining the students are directed to sit on the benches outside their classrooms and wait to be invited in by their classroom teacher. Members of the Leadership Team will walk around the verandahs to supervise the students.

After school, we have several families playing on the school grounds. Once the children are dismissed and with you, our duty of care is discharged. If students are not with family members they will be asked to come to the office until they are picked up so we can make sure all students are safe while under our care. I encourage you to take advantage of our wonderful Nature Playground on the oval or the playground in the park if you would like to play rather than on the school grounds so we can ensure our duty of care.

Next week, Mrs Beth Westerlund and Miss Joy Facchin will be administering the Pre-Primary, On-Entry Assessment. The main purpose of the On-entry Assessment Program, (which is part of the state assessment schedule with the Education Department) is to provide teachers with information about the skills and understandings that a child brings to school. Conducting this assessment early in the year ensures that your child's teacher has information about the current skills and understandings of each child to assist in the planning and development of targeted learning programs that address the needs of each individual and identify children who may require early intervention or extension. This approach is supported by national and international research into the early identification of students' literacy and numeracy skills. The teachers will share this information with parents once it has been finalised.

Furthermore, Mrs Mickler is working behind the scenes to set up our NAPLAN for our Year 3 and Year 5 students. As children progress through their school years, checks must be made along the way to see how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and mathematics – skills that will set them on the path to success as adults. NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared it with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress. Information regarding NAPLAN for our Year 3 and Year 5 students was sent home today. If you did not receive this information, please contact Mrs Mickler.

Today is Safer Internet day! Marking its 20th year, <u>Safer Internet Day</u> is here and we are calling on everyone to **Connect. Reflect. Protect.** whenever they are online.

Connect safely by keeping apps and devices secure and regularly review your privacy settings.

SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING!

Dear Parents,

Your school photo day is coming! Every student will receive a personalised flyer to bring home from Kapture Photography containing your child's unique codes for ordering school photos online either today or tomorrow.

Order EARLY for sibling photography

Sibling photos can ONLY be ordered online. Once you receive the personalised flyers for your children, it is imperative that you order your sibling photo early to avoid missing out! There is a physical limit in the school schedule to how many sibling photos can be taken. Once the maximum capacity of sibling orders has been reached, no more sibling orders can be placed.

If maximum capacity is not reached, sibling orders close 12pm midday sharp, one business day prior to the first photo day.

The school or the photographers cannot accept late orders for sibling photography. Please do not ask as your request simply cannot be accommodated.

Order EARLY for discount photo day prices

Order your photos within 10 calendar days of photo day to receive discount photo day prices. Late orders are handled separately to the school delivery and incur a \$30 custom service charge.

Other information

Please note; class, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online prior to purchase.

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please check the FAQ's on the Kapture website.

All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group presentation available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should **NOT** be included in the photo shoot –please contact the school office.

Wembley Downs Primary School would like to congratulate Soli and his team for this fabulous achievement.




P&C


